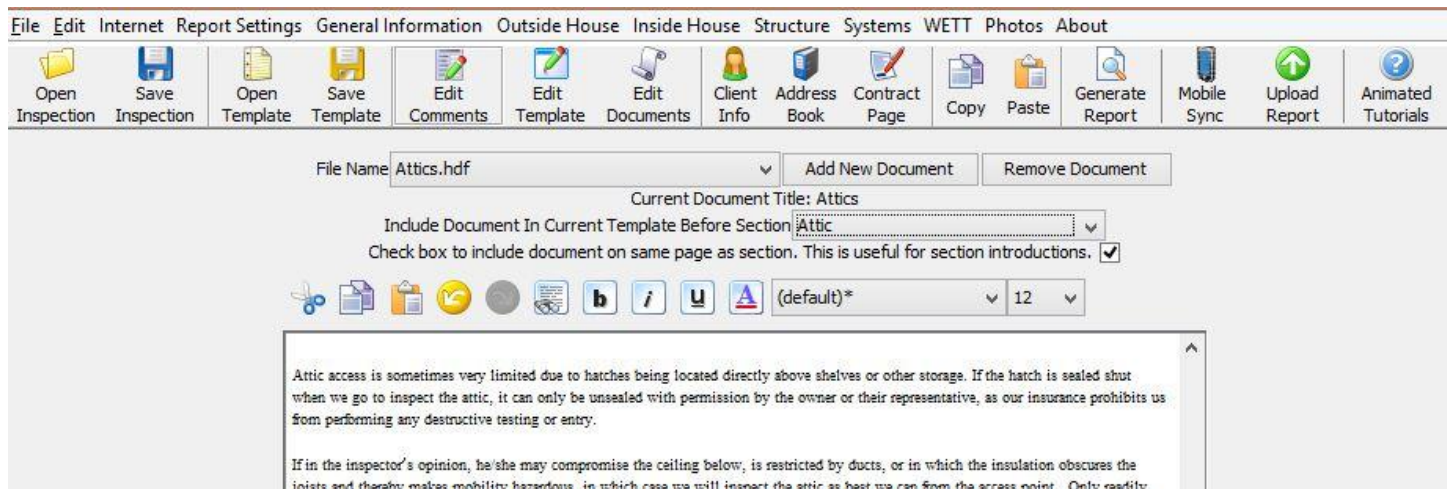


Hey all!

A few of us here have put in some time to make a template that is much more similar to the Palm Tech template we are used to. I performed an inspection using it yesterday and it was a WAY smoother inspection than when I used the original template. You will require 3 files for these instructions (a .tpz file, a HIP_Documents.zip file and a Glossary.xml file). Here is what you need to do with them (if you want to use our template). My instructions are assuming you are not using a MAC, if you are the folder locations will be a bit different. You will have to edit the damage panels to suit your current libraries; we haven't cleaned that part up. Also note, the WETT and fireplace and stove have not been updated yet but this should give you a good start.

- **ABCHI-2015.tpz** - Copy this file in to the **C:\Program Files (x86)\Home Inspector Pro\Data** folder
- **HIP_Documents.zip** - This folder contains a bunch of disclaimer files that we are putting before every section in the report. Unzip these files to the **C:\Program Files (x86)\Home Inspector Pro\Data\Documents** folder. Make a backup of the existing files beforehand if you like.
- **Glossary.xml** - Copy this file to the **C:\Program Files (x86)\Home Inspector Pro\Data** folder replacing the existing file of the same name. Again, make a backup of the existing file if you want

Now, open up HIP, click on the Open Template button at the top to choose this template. Then click on the **Edit Documents** button on the top toolbar and assign the document to the appropriate section of the report. Also check the box to keep the document text on the same page (see image below)



Next, from the menu, Select **Report Settings/Glossary**, click on the **Print Settings** button and check on **Enable Glossary**, See image below
